UPDATES TO SIMAP SUBSCRIPTION TYPES

Starting January 1, 2021, we will no longer offer "Basic" accounts in SIMAP

We are discontinuing the 2-month free "Basic" account in SIMAP. We will continue to offer [Tier 1 and Tier 2 subscriptions](#). This change will help us better support SIMAP subscribers.

To ensure that this change does not result in campuses being precluded from assessing their carbon and nitrogen footprints, we will begin offering:

- Need-based fee waivers for Tier 1 subscriptions for SIMAP users that do not have the budget to cover the license fee
- Additional complimentary Tier 1 or Tier 2 Research Accounts for campuses that are SIMAP subscribers

Both will be available by application starting January 1st, 2021. Please contact us at simap@unh.edu if you are interested in applying for a need-based SIMAP account or an additional research-focused account.

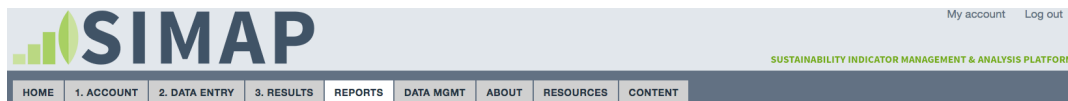

NEW WORKING GROUP ON NITROGEN FOOTPRINTS

This winter, we are launching the SIMAP Nitrogen Working Group.



NITROGEN WORKING GROUP

The Nitrogen Working Group will lead research, development, application, and communication for campus nitrogen footprints.

The [Nitrogen Working Group](#) will be co-facilitated with nitrogen experts Jim Galloway and Libby Dukes from the University of Virginia. The working group will focus on several goals:

- enhance outreach and communication around the campus nitrogen footprint,
- address nitrogen emission factor gaps in SIMAP, and
- provide recommendations for best practices on data collection and validation.

COMING SOON: 2020 VERSION OF EMISSION FACTORS

This January, we will release the SIMAP 2020 version of emission factors, which will include comprehensive updates to the most current data sets across all categories. Additional new features will include:

- **Biogenic emission factors:** The biogenic portion of CO₂ emissions will be separated out into biogenic CO₂ emission factors. Currently, the CO₂ emission factors include biogenic and non-biogenic CO₂, and the allocation calculations happen behind the scenes. These new biogenic emission factors will add transparency and visibility to the biogenic footprint. The update will also include a Biogenic Report.
- **20-year Global Warming Potential:** This update will add the option to view your footprint results using 20-year GWPs, which provide an estimate of the shorter-term warming effect of your emissions. This will be in addition to the currently available 100-year GWPs.
- **Air travel radiative forcing selection:** You will be able to select your radiative forcing value on the Data Mgmt tab.

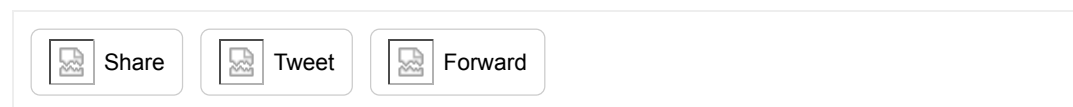
GENERAL SIMAP UPDATES

User Agreement: We added the following language to the [SIMAP User Agreement](#): "The terms for purchasing a SIMAP license are described in this user agreement. Please note that we cannot accept any additional terms in a PO. By paying for a SIMAP license, you agree that any additional terms in a PO are null and void and that the SIMAP user agreement solely governs your use of SIMAP." Data reviews: As of July 1, 2020, [data reviews](#) are add-on services and are separate from Tier 1 and Tier 2 subscriptions. SIMAP accounts purchased prior to this date still come with a complimentary data review. Please contact us for more information.
